

**The SOUL Foundation: Give and Gain Recycling  
1000 Schools/ Churches Campaign  
DRAFT SCHEDULE: WASTE RECYCLING OPPORTUNITY\*  
For JhB/Gauteng area From June 2009**  
(We will expand the program to other areas within the next few months)



**Introduction**

As part of our drive to relieve the stress of our uncontrolled waste management on our groundwater and rivers SOUL Foundation are in the process of establishing an extended partnership with all the major recyclers so that we can assure ongoing collection service of pre-sorted recyclables from your premises and payment for the recyclables directly to the school/church designated bank account. We will also draft an agreement which will formalize this arrangement between the school and our recycling partners.

We will arrange supply of recycling skips from the recyclers to store the recyclables to be collected.

Recyclable categories are:

Glass, paper, plastic, tins and cardboard.

**Establish System:**

***Payable in advance @ R3000***

We charge R3000 (*payable in advance*) to establish the collection system and signed agreement with the recyclers to pay income directly to the school. This process takes 4 to 6 weeks. The recyclers supply the relevant collection skips and collect recyclables from the school/church designated recycling storage area. The storage area requires easy access for collection trucks and drop off by Parents/parishioners.

**Training:**

***Payable in advance @ R2000***

We would train existing cleaning staff, pupils, parishioners and anyone requiring training at the school/church on site to assist with establishing the systems for a max period of 1 week (5 working days) at a cost of R2000.

**Equipment:**

***Payable with order***

For waste separation on the school/church grounds we can supply color coded Otto bins at R950 a bin labeled by recyclable type, *or* we can supply 220L drums for R300 a drum which the school/church can color code. Alternately schools and churches can source/ supply their own drums. The recyclers supply the relevant collection skips and collect recyclables from the school/church designated recycling storage area.

**Waste from Home:**

***Payable with order- minimum order 300 sets of bags @ R125 a set***

we also supply 'Recycling Packs' which are recycled reusable poly-prop bags color-coded for the waste types. The bags would have to be replenished approx every 4 to 6 months.

The bags are used for 'Waste from Home', to enable recyclables to be pre-sorted at home and brought to school/church to empty in to the relevant recycling collection

bin (skip) by parents/ parishioners. The bags cost R125 a set and comprise 5 reusable bags color coded for glass, paper, plastic, tins and cardboard. Parents/ Parishioners can purchase these from the school/church.

**All quoted costs exclude 14% VAT**

**Income for the School/Church:**

The school / church will receive an average minimum of R250 per ton for recyclables. If the school/church has 1000 pupils/parishioners you have potential to produce: approx 1 ton a day for the school of which 70% is recyclable. = 0.7 ton per day approx 3 ton a day from 'Waste from Home' of which 70% is recyclable = 2.1 Ton per day = 2.8 Ton a day at R250= approx R700 per day and approx R14 000 per month. Payment for recyclables made directly to the school/church designated bank account by the purchasing recyclers at the end of each month.
