

**The SOUL Foundation: Give and Gain Recycling
1000 Schools/ Churches Campaign
* WASTE RECYCLING OPPORTUNITY*
For JhB, Gauteng area From January 2010**
(We will expand the program to other areas within the next year)



Introduction

As part of our drive to relieve the stress of uncontrolled waste management on our groundwater and rivers and raising awareness on the benefits of going green, SOUL Foundation has established an extended partnership with all major recyclers so that we can assure that schools/churches and their relevant Households/parents/parishioners have the opportunity to recyclable their waste with a system where recyclables can be conveniently dropped off at the school/church at a designated, clean and safe drop off point, generating income for the school/church.

The system includes the collection of the pre-sorted on-site waste at the school/church and a "Waste from Home" convenient drop off for parents and/or parishioners. Payment for the collected pre-sorted recyclables (at an agreed rate), is paid directly to the school/church designated bank account. A Service Agreement is entered into which formalizes this arrangement between the school or church, SOUL Foundation and our recycling partners.

The Service Agreement includes the establishment of a reliable and regular collection system of the recyclables from your premises and the supply of the **onsite** waste separation systems and equipment required for the success of the program as well as management of the collection system and quality assurance by our recycling partners and your SOUL Give & Gain service agent.

SOUL Contracted Recycling Collection Management Partner Members

- Supply onsite recycling storage equipment and management of site.
- Supply Waste Management services
- Regular collections and reporting on weights collected, GHG's reduced and payments made to the school/church.
- Pay income generated from recyclables collected directly to the school/church.

- **Recyclable materials for collection:**
- Scrap cardboard, Plastic LD/Shrink-wrap/HD/PET,
- Paper HL1/HL2/CMW/Magazines/Flat news/Craft news, Paper Reels,
- Cans, Glass bottles, Scrap Metal
- Used cooking oil, Used Hydraulic/Engine Oil
- E-waste, Ink Cartridges
- Additional recyclables will be included should they arise.
- A composting system for wet/food waste is in development.
- Adhoc Hazardous waste that may be generated will be quoted on as required.

Establish System:

Payable in advance @ R3000

We charge R3000 (*payable in advance*) to establish the collection system and signed agreement with the recyclers to pay income directly to the school. This process takes 2 to 4 weeks. The service agreement includes: The collection system and the supply of **onsite** waste separation systems and equipment from the recyclers to store the recyclables to be collected as well as management of the collection system and quality assurance by our recycling partners and your designated SOUL Give and Gain

service agent. A modest monthly service fee is charged for this service recycling collection company.

The storage area requires easy access for collection trucks and drop off by Parents/parishioners.

SOUL Obligatory Waste from Home: Color-Coded Recycling Bags
Payable with order- minimum order 300 sets of bags @ R150 a set

SOUL supplies specially designed 'Recycling Packs' which are recycled reusable poly-prop bags, color-coded for the waste types: glass (Monday), paper (Tues), plastic (Wed), cans (Thurs) and cardboard (Friday). The bags enable efficient separation at home and are replenished (repurchased) approx every 4 to 6 months. Old bags are delivered to the school/church where they are collected for recycling.

The bags are used for Soul's 'Waste from Home' Initiative, to enable recyclables to be pre-sorted at home by parents /parishioners and brought to school/church drop off zone ON THE DESIGNATED "Waste type Day" where the full bag is handed in and replaced with a new bag. The bags cost R150 a set and comprise 5 reusable bags color coded for glass, paper, plastic, tins and cardboard.

Parents/ Parishioners can purchase these from the school/church.

All quoted costs exclude 14% VAT

STANDARD REFUSE BAGS INCLUDING BLUE BAGS ARE NOT utilized AS THEY CREATE MORE WASTE and are not clearly marked for waste separation.

Potential Income for the School/Church per 1000 pupils including Waste from Home utilising SOUL Waste from Home color-coded bags:

The school / church will receive an agreed rate of remuneration @ R250 per ton for all recyclables.

1000 pupils/parishioners have potential to produce:

approx 1 ton a day for the school of which 70% is recyclable. = 0.7 ton per day

approx 3 ton a day from 'Waste from Home' of which 70% is recyclable

= 2.1 Ton per day

= 2.8 Ton a day at R250= approx R700 per day and approx R14 000 per month.

Payment for recyclables made directly to the school/church designated bank account by the purchasing recyclers at the end of each month less the monthly service fee.
